1981 Tree with figures.

Subject was pottery production with combined woodcut and coloured lithograph.

1985 Womens Series.

15 prints

Ukiyo-E technique with bold flat colours portraying the problems besetting economically dependent women attempting to retain some identity.

1986 Miniature Series.

Women at work and leisure. Ukiyo-E technique with transparent subtle colours. Miniature size was down to 50 mm by 50 mm.
